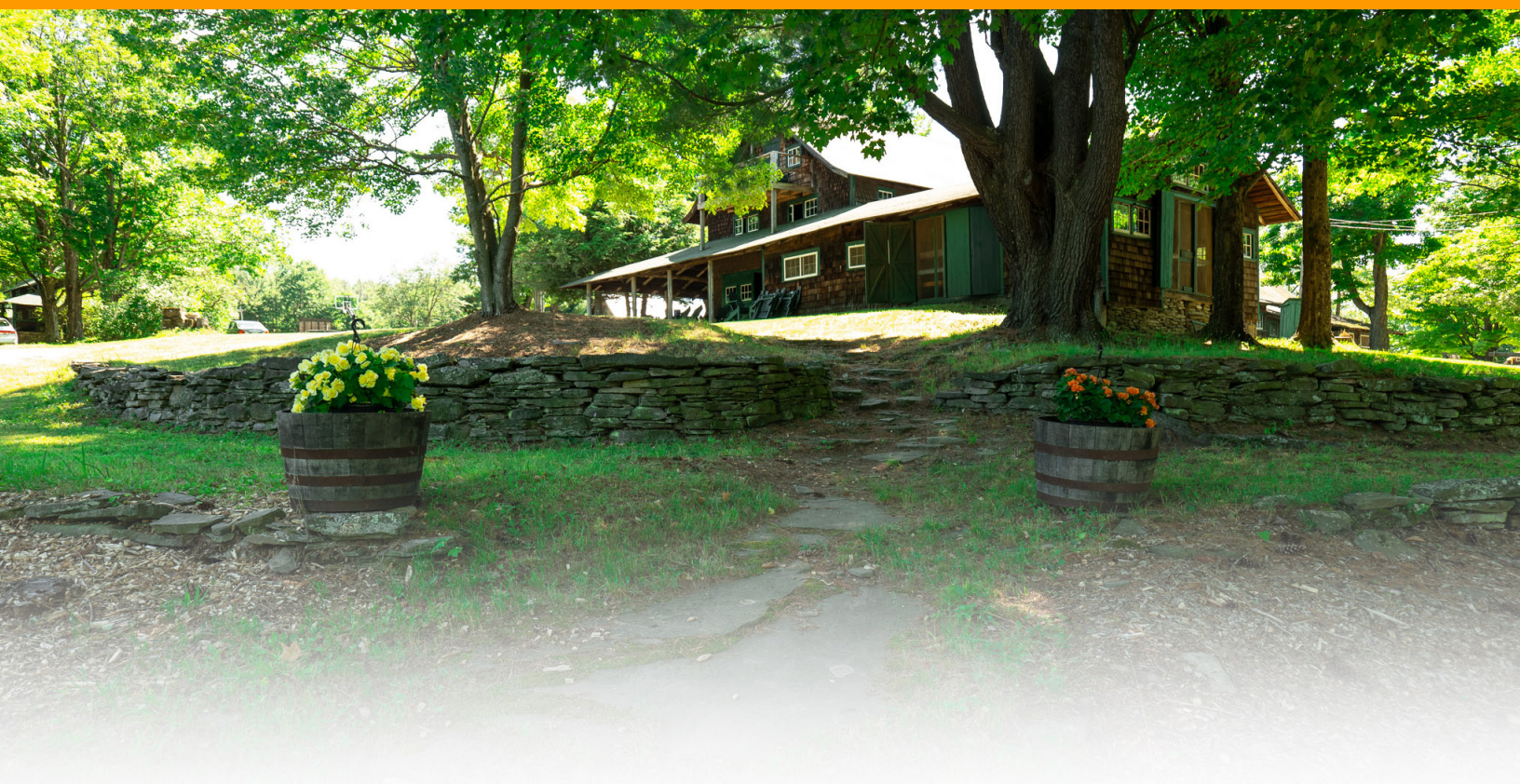

The campaign has continued to thrive! For the summer of 2021, Susquehannock unveiled new playing surfaces which included a new, full-size basketball court and street hockey court as well as two new pickle ball courts. In addition, Susquehannock was able complete a total kitchen renovation.

In 2022, Susquehannock announced the funding for a brand-new full-size soccer/lacrosse/football field. Construction is scheduled for spring/summer 2022 with a grand opening in the summer of 2023. Our efforts did not end there; Susquehannock was also able to build 75 new beds, complete seven new roofs, purchase generators, maintenance equipment and the renovation of existing decks and stairs.

Finally, we will be providing full and/or partial scholarships to seventeen children this summer. This is all part of our “camper sponsorship” program where people like yourself can sponsor tuition for a young child.

This was all made possible through the generosity of alumni, parents and friends of Susquehannock. Without your support, Susquehannock could not succeed.

Elisabeth Sayre Hoopes Gilbert (1937-2022)

Lisa was born in Philadelphia and moved with her family from Rosemont, PA to their home in Montrose, PA just before college. There she fell in love with horses and was happy to have an excellent instructor. She did become a top notch horseback rider. She found that she could take her much loved horse Mingo with her to Penn State, where she met her husband, Ron Gilbert, who was also boarding a horse there. They were married in 1960 in the First Presbyterian Church in Montrose. She graduated from Penn State and went on to participate annually with Mingo in the Penn National Horse Show and many smaller shows. She taught arts & crafts for many years in the York, PA schools. She became the riding instructor at Camp Susquehannock for Boys for 20 years. She and Ron had three children: Cynthia Sayre Gilbert, Elisabeth Anne Gilbert and Daniel Lawrence Gilbert.

Hollis “Holly” Titman (1939-2022)

Holly and her brother, John, were the children of John “D” Titman, who helped King Shafer tremendously in the founding and development of Camp Susquehannock. “D” built the fourth cottage on the left side of Tripp Lake. “D” did the work, and King bought the materials. “D’s” children, Holly and John inherited and shared the cottage each summer, one in July, one in August.



Holly generally came in July. She was a sunny and friendly presence to the Denham’s next door and all who knew her. She had grown up in Montrose and Binghamton, graduated from Skidmore College, and then worked for NBC in NYC. She married Jack Sebastian and they had two children, Sara and Steve. They were divorced, and Holly married second, Edward Ellis. They had one child, Martha. In 1969, Holly and her children moved to Louisville.

Holly had a passionate spirit and adored classical music, opera, dance and other cultural pursuits, which inspired others around her. She curious and adventurous. She had myriad creative talents, especially as a masterful seamstress, knitter and cook. She dearly loved her children and grandchildren, and was always ready to play with them in ping pong or other games. She always made any occasion light and full of laughter. Holly’s very favorite places were New York City, and the quiet Tripp lake cottage, where she spent summers nearly all her life.

Holly died May 25, 2022, in Louisville, age 93. She is survived by her children: Chris and Steve Sebastian, Sara Sweet and Martha McMahan; sons-in-law David Sweet and Jeff McMahan; and grandchildren Bonnie and Jordan Sweet, Maggie and Sara McMahan.

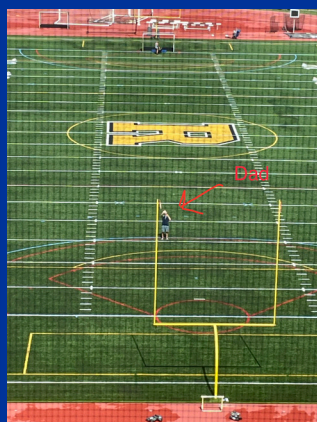
